MESA, Arizona -- Dec. 4, 2020 -- The Santander Consumer USA Inc. Foundation ("SC Foundation") awards a \$50,000 grant to the Maricopa Community Colleges Foundation to support low-income and underrepresented student entrepreneurs enrolled in the Mesa Community College Green Flag program during the 2020-2021 academic year.

Small businesses are the backbone of our economy. However, across the nation, nine out of 10 business startups fail within three years due to lack of capital, mentoring and the structural resources needed to prosper.

Education and training from MCC expert educators and the business acumen and connections provided by businesses in the East
