1. Sports facilities on days when there aren't games or events scheduled, such as the University of Phoenix Stadium, 1 Cardinals Dr., Glendale. With 14,000 surrounding parking spaces, there's plenty of room to practice basic skills and parking.

2. Any community college campus on weekends. Mesa Community College is the largest of the 10 community colleges in the Maricopa County Community College District, 1833 W Southern Ave, Mesa. Maximum speed on campus is 15 miles per hour.

3. Industrial parks on weekends, such as the ASU Research Park, the 320 acres is crisscrossed with winding streets, stop signs and cul-de-sacs and spotted with lakes, jogging trails and picnic ramadas, 8750 S. Science Dr., Tempe. Maximum speed is 35 miles per hour.
