ADMISSIONS INTRUCTIONS FOR FALL 2019

Please read the following instructions carefully:

1. **All prerequisites must be completed or “in progress” and transcripts attached at the time the application is submitted.**

- **High school graduation or a valid GED**
- Cumulative college grade point average of **2.0** or higher.
- All prerequisite courses must be completed with a “C” or higher.
- ENG101 and ENG102
- MAT120, 121 or 122 (MAT141, MAT142 are **not** eligible math courses)
- CRE101 or tested out at testing center
- CHM130 and CHM130
- BIO181 (**Must** have been taken within last **5** years of application)
- VET101 (ANS110AA accepted as substitute until May 2019)

2. **Transcripts**— should include all work shown as completed on the application. One complete set of **unofficial** college transcripts is required from each school attended. This includes Mesa Community College. Please make sure to submit a Request for Evaluation form to have your transcripts from other schools evaluated. This is important to make sure you are on track for graduation. Do Not assume a class will transfer for credit.

Note: ALL college transcripts are required, even if the courses do not seem relevant. An application that is not complete and/or does not have all transcripts included will not be considered.

Previous Applicants— who have applied during the previous application window, do not need to submit duplicate transcripts, as we keep documentation for the next application period; however you must submit a current application and transcripts showing coursework you may have completed since the previous application. We will also keep your references on file for the next application period as well.

3. **Tetanus toxoid**—proof of Tetanus toxoid being administered within the last 7 years needs to be attached to the application.
4. **Animal-related work experience**— Animal-related work experience can be voluntary or paid. It is important that this experience include hands-on work with taking care of animals. Work experience also needs to be supervised and can not include owning your own pets or pet sitting. **A minimum of 200 hours of animal-related work experience is required.** This experience can include receptionist at a veterinary clinic, kennel help, veterinary assistant, animal husbandry, etc. If you are unsure ask the program staff to clarify. You will need to include a letter from your supervisor that documents the exactly number of hours performed.
5. **Letters of reference**— attach 3 letters of reference , signed and sealed in an envelope. One letter from an academic professor (preferably from a science course), one letter from a supervisor observing your animal-related work experience (this letter can include your animal care experience documentation or from a separate supervisor) and one letter from a person who has known you at least 3 years and is not family.

Selection Procedure

Step 1: Students not meeting minimum eligibility requirements or incomplete applications will be removed from the applicant pool and their applications will not be evaluated.

Step 2: All qualified applicants will be scored using an objective rubric that evaluates the applicants for each of the required application requirements.

Step 3: All applicants will be notified by e-mail of their program status by June 15, 2019. **Keep your email information current and legible.**

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- It is required that the Veterinary Technology Curriculum be completed in sequence within two years. Exceptions may be granted by the program director to individual students on a case-by-case basis.
- To qualify for licensure, you must have an AAS degree in Veterinary Technology from an AVMA-accredited program. In order to receive the AAS degree in Veterinary Technology at Mesa Community College, all general education and graduation requirements must be met. A minimum GPA of 2.0 is required for graduation from the Veterinary Technology program.
- Enrollment at Mesa Community College does not constitute eligibility for the Veterinary Technology Program. Registration for first and second year Veterinary Technology Program courses is not allowed until after the applicant has been notified in writing of their acceptance into the program.
- It is expected that the student applying to the Veterinary Technology Program has read and understands the Veterinary Technology Student handbook. The handbook have be found on the application process page at www.mesacc.edu.

Your application will be considered incomplete and will not be evaluated without unofficial transcripts and proof of immunization attached.

VI. Letters of Recommendation

To aid us in the evaluation of applicants for experience and aptitude, you are asked to attach to this application (3) three signed letters of recommendation. These recommendation letters are considered an integral part of the application and its evaluation. Each letter must include a contact phone number or e-mail address at which the Program could contact the recommending party. One letter is requested from a college instructor from whom you have taken a course. One letter is requested from a supervisor or other responsible person representing a site where you obtained animal experience. One letter is requested from a responsible adult other than an immediate or extended family member who has been acquainted with you for at least 3 years.

You may submit the application by bringing it to the Technology Department office in the TC50 building and requesting it be placed in Dr. Focht's mailbox. Please request a date and time notation be placed on your application by office staff.

Note: You **must** have submitted the completed application and associated documents **and** be officially notified of your acceptance into the Veterinary Technology Program **before** you will be allowed to attend Program courses,

Deadline for submission of all applications is Wednesday, May 1, 2019, to be considered for admission to the Fall 2019 class.
