## ASSESSMENT SELECTION FOR NEXT SESSION

## The General Assembly,

*Recognizing* the unique cultural heritage, economic potential, and potential for peace with the Republic of Lebanon as an ally of Western Sahara's largest stakeholder,

Aware of the conflict between Morocco and Western Sahara and possible solutions for peace,

Acknowledging the significance of Western Sahara as the largest non-self-governing nation with over 500,000 residents,

*Emphasizing* the need for financial aid from fellow member states to support Western Sahara's call for self-governance,

Strongly supporting the efforts made by regional and international stakeholders that may have a significant influence on Western Sahara,

Noting the significance of civil war as a call to urgency for the self-determination of Western Sahara.

- 1. Calls for the end of hostility between Morocco and Western Sahara:
  - a. Resumption of negotiations under the lead of the United Nations to reach a peaceful and acceptable solution to the longstanding dispute,
  - b. Engage in civil discussion regarding the territory discourse,
  - c. Encourage regional and international stakeholders to support the negotiation process and refrain from actions that could undermine the efforts for a peaceful resolution;

## 2. <u>Proposes</u> Member States to:

- a. Support efforts to resolve the Western Sahara conflict through peaceful means, including through mediation and negotiation,
- b. Contribute to humanitarian assistance efforts in the Western Sahara to address the needs of affected populations,

- c. Promote cultural exchange and cooperation with the Western Sahara through initiatives such as academic exchanges, cultural festivals, and tourism promotion;
- 3. <u>Encourages</u> the United Nations Mission for the Referendum in Western Sahara (MINURSO) to:
  - a. Continue to monitor and report on human rights violations in the Western Sahara, including those related to the preservation of cultural heritage,
  - b. Support confidence-building measures and initiatives aimed at promoting reconciliation and dialogue among the parties to the conflict,
  - c. Coordinate with other United Nations agencies and international organizations to support economic development initiatives in the Western Sahara;
- 4. Recommends all parties involved in the Western Sahara conflict to:
  - a. Commit to a comprehensive and inclusive dialogue aimed at finding a peaceful and lasting solution to the conflict,
  - b. Respect and protect the cultural heritage of the Western Sahara, including its traditional practices, languages, and customs,
  - c. Cooperate with the United Nations and relevant international organizations in efforts to preserve and promote the cultural heritage of the Western Sahara;
- 5. <u>Calls upon</u> the international community to:
  - a. Provide technical and financial support for the implementation of this resolution in coordination with the relevant United Nations agencies and local stakeholders in Western Sahara.
