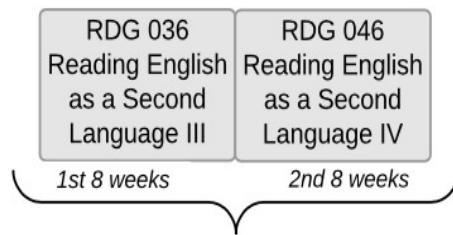
Reading and English Flow Chart 2022-2023

The English Language Program (ELP) at Mesa Community College offers a course of study designed to provide English language learners with balanced academic language skills to promote student success in higher education and the global workplace.

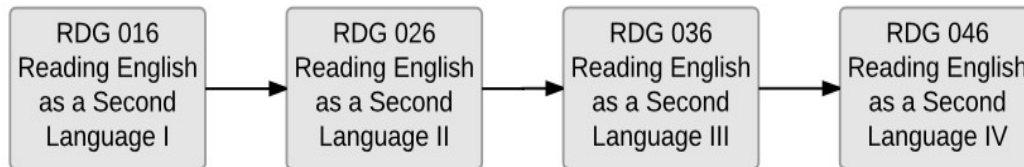
Reading ESL Path:

Accelerated ESL Reading Courses

The Reading Department offers one combination of accelerated/intensive ESL courses. Courses are 3 units and 8 weeks in length. This means that in one semester, students complete two ESL reading courses (6 units).

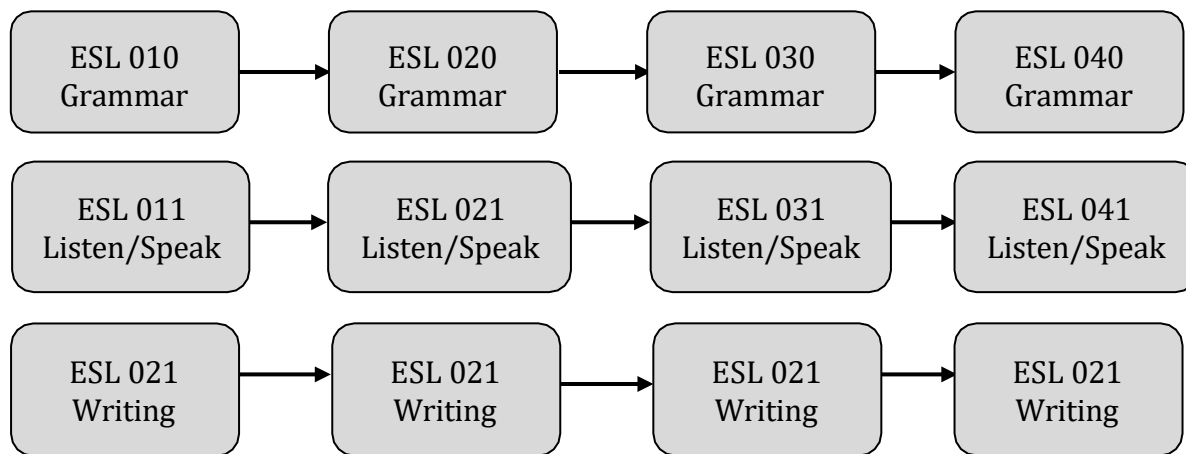


Traditional Reading ESL Courses

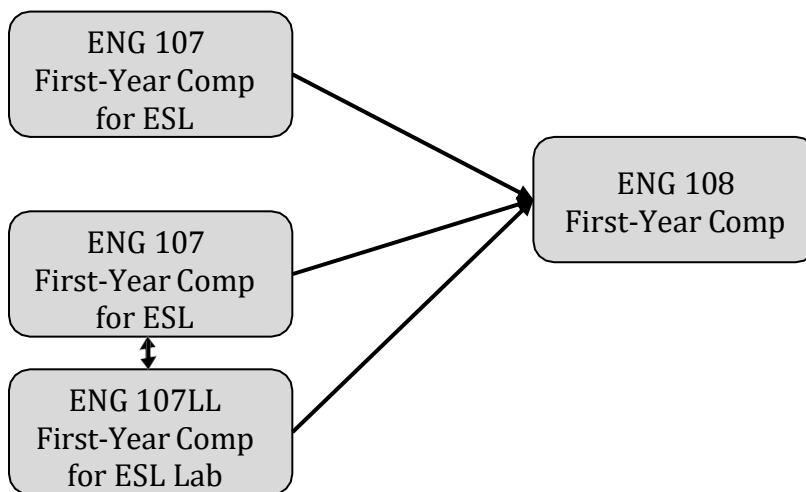


English ESL Path:

Students may place directly into ENG107 (equivalent of ENG101), based on their placement scores. If students need additional support, as indicated by their placement score, they will enroll in ENG107 with support (ENG107LL). Students cannot be exempt from ENG107 and ENG108 based on placement scores. Placement into college-level classes are based on Accuplacer/WritePlacer/EdReady English and Reading tests. Students may be required to take grammar, listening and speaking, and idiomatic English prior to enrolling in college-level classes based on their TOEFL, IELTS, Duolingo, or CELSA scores.






College-level ESL Courses:



Students enroll in ENG107 and ENG107LL during the same semester with the same instructor. Students receive additional support with reading and writing processes.

Placement within the English and Reading sequences will be determined by the following:

Placement Measure	Criteria
TOEFL, IELTS, Duolingo, and CELSA	 See Placement Chart. 
ACCUPLACER and WritePlacer Scores	Taken within the last two years.
EdReady Scores	Currently EdReady scores do not expire. See EdReady Course Placement Chart.
