

Namibia Study Abroad Nambia, Africa | May 27 - June 20, 2025

Required Pre-departure Hybrid Coursework: May 12-23, 2025

A trek through the wilds of Africa will probably be the single most adventurous and exciting thing that you will ever do! In true safari style, you'll travel Namibia in 4x4's, exploring Africa's amazing wildlife, breathtaking landscapes, unique people and ecosystems. Accommodations will be a mixture of camping, staying in an authentic Himba village, hostels, and bed and breakfasts.

You'll visit Etosha National Park with Africa's big five (lion, elephant, buffalo, rhino, leopard), come face to face with cheetahs at the Cheetah Conservation Fund, build an elephant-proof stone wall and track the very rare desert elephants at EHRA, stay at a Himba village, and bushcamp in the world's oldest desert. By exploring the wildlife, flora, people, and landscapes of Namibia, you'll learn about global conservation, biodiversity and environmental issues, as well as the impact of expanding human populations and climate change. You'll use field techniques to census wildlife and examine environmental topics such as biodiversity loss and human-wildlife conflict.

To complement the environmental and conservation biology themes, you will also learn about the birds of Namibia with an introduction to ornithology.

With a mix of wilderness bush camping, rest camps, relaxing starlight campfires, BBQ's, and unique wildlife everywhere, this will be the learning adventure of a lifetime! But you'll also have down time for optional activities like dune surfing and adventure sports at Swakopmund on Namibia's coast.

Namibia is located on the southwestern coast of Africa, sharing borders with South Africa and Botswana to the east and Angola to the north. Namibia's landscape includes open grasslands, pans, dry riverbeds and dense woodlands. Namibia has the oldest desert in the world, the Namibia, a long coastline dotted with shipwrecks and diamond mines, as well as abundant wildlife.

Marine Biology in Puerto Peñasco Puerto Peñasco, Mexico (Rocky Point) | May 11 - 18, 2025

This introduction course to Marine Biology, designed for the non-major, will take you to the Sea of Cortez (our nearest ocean experience), which has one of the best intertidal expanses in the world! At low tide, as much as 300 feet of what was once covered by the sea is exposed. Students will visit and learn about different aquatic habitats as well the organisms that live there. They will take part in an ongoing scientific survey of intertidal organisms in local habitats as well as sea lions and local bird populations. In addition to biology, our study abroad also focuses on the effects of the ocean on local culture and business.

Educational excursions include talks from local experts on whales and other large animals of the Sea of Cortez (Gulf of California) at the Center for the Study of Deserts and Oceans (CEDO); birdwatching while kayaking through the Morua Estuary; a boat trip to Isla de San Jorge to view, snorkel or possibly scuba dive with a sea lion colony, and group excursions to explore the town of Puerto Peñasco in the evenings. Accommodations are in CEDO dormitories, the base of operations for the trip. The program fee includes van transportation, lodging, and some meals.

Study Abroad in Japan: Japanese Language & Psychology and Culture Fukuoka, Japan | June 1 - 16, 2025

Required Pre-departure Online Coursework: May 12-30, 2025

Take advantage of this extraordinary opportunity in Fukuoka, Japan, where you will learn the language as well as conduct a psychological analysis of the traditional and current Japanese pop cultures.

Excursions will include visits to a tech-related company, the Dazaifu Tenmangu shrine and Kyushu National and Kitakyushu Manga museums, participation in a Hakata doll painting and Japanese tea ceremony as well as the opportunity to watch a Japanese baseball game. You will also visit the Ohori Park Japanese Garden/Art Museum, visit local schools and have a kimono dress-up experience.

Highlights of your stay in Japan will include 4 nights with a local Japanese host family. This is a rare opportunity to establish relationships with Japanese people and to learn the way of life in Japan!

Study Abroad Ireland

Athlone, Republic of Ireland | June 7 - July 5, 2025

Spend summer school in Ireland and see for yourself why the country is nicknamed the Emerald Island!

Held on the campus of Technological University of the Shannon, located in picturesque Athlone, Co. Westmeath, you will spend a full month immersing in the study of Irish culture and history while exploring and experiencing the rich and diverse heritage of Ireland. Using Athlone as a home base, participants will make field trips to locations such as the prehistorical monuments at Loughcrew and the Hill of Uisneach, the early Medieval monastic city of Clonmacnoise and the Norman castles of Dunamase and Trim, and the 18th Century great house, Emo Court. You will also spend several days in Galway, Ireland's Cultural Heart, visiting the Burren, the Cliffs of Moher, and the island of Inis Mor, as well as a day-trip to Dublin City. Your Irish adventure will be a learning experience you will never forget!

Canterbury and London Study Abroad Canterbury and London, England | June 14 - 29, 2025

Pre-departure Mandatory Orientation: May 3, 2025 **Required Pre-departure Classes:** May 26, 2025 - June 9, 2025

Required Post-trip Classes: July 9, 2025 and July 11, 2025

Complement your learning with an immersive cultural and educational experience in England. For two weeks, continue your literature studies in Canterbury, England, on the University of Kent campus–living among the local student population, learning in the school's classrooms, and experiencing college life at a British university. Take two full-day trips to London to visit the Tower of London, Shakespeare's Globe, St. Paul's Cathedral, and other amazing historical and cultural sites that England's capital has to offer. Visit Hever Castle, the childhood home of Anne Boleyn, and Dover Castle, a medieval castle and one of the most important fortresses in England's history. Walk along the White Cliffs of Dover. Study theory and literature while exploring the sites, settings, and inspirations of selected writers' work–including those linked to the volatile reign of Henry VIII.

The University of Kent is a research-led British university in Canterbury, England. Canterbury, the birthplace of Renaissance playwrights Christopher Marlowe and Aphra Behn, is a beautiful small British town in southeastern England that retains a medieval feel. Located roughly 60 miles east of London and 150 miles northwest of Paris, Canterbury is home to the Canterbury Cathedral (the pilgrimage site on which Chaucer's Canterbury Tales is based) and the Benedictine monastery of St. Augustine's Abbey. Medieval walls surround the city, the majority still with original construction; you can walk along the walls while touring the town or simply making your way to a local hotspot.

Required Online Pre-departure Coursework: July 7-11, 2025

Big Ben. Robin Hood. The Eiffel Tower. The Louvre. The British Museum. You can spend part of the summer exploring these world renowned sites and more as you contrast the cultures of England and France. We will explore the historical, artistic, literary, and social contexts of these different countries and cultures while you create your own personal memories and narratives.

Spend over 3 weeks exploring the history and modernity of some of the world's greatest cities, including London, England and Paris, France. Excursions include, but are not limited to: the Victoria & Albert and British Museums (in London), Tower of London, Chatsworth (in Derbyshire, England), Newstead Abbey, and 4 days/3 nights in Paris where we will visit the Louvre, the Musée d'Orsay, the Eiffel Tower, and more!

Our home during the program is Nottingham, England, which is associated with the legend of Robin Hood in the Sherwood Forest and the defeat of Richard III, former king of England. Nottingham is a vibrant, walkable city in the East Midlands region of central England where the average temperature in July is 70 degrees!

From the peaceful hills of Umbria to the historic streets of Rome, you'll explore elements of Italian culture, psychology, history, economy, and lifestyle that promote a deeper connection with oneself, others, and the environment.

Wander through the fascinating, medieval streets of Perugia, Umbria's capital. This city is known for its lively arts scene and incredible craftsmanship. Taste the region's famous chocolate and explore its fascinating history, from its Etruscan origins to Renaissance art.

Experience the peacefulness of Assisi, a UNESCO World Heritage site and the birthplace of St. Francis. Visit the stunning Basilica of St. Francis, with its beautiful frescoes by Giotto, and learn how tradition and sustainability can go hand in hand.

Visit Lake Trasimeno, Italy's fourth-largest lake, surrounded by quaint villages and lush scenery. Here, you'll connect with the area's rich history and natural beauty while exploring the ideas behind the economics of slow tourism.

Discover Rome, the Eternal City, through the eyes of slow living. Walk among the ancient ruins of the Colosseum, soak in the grandeur of St. Peter's Basilica, and admire the art in the Vatican Museums—all while embracing a more mindful way of traveling. Gilman International Scholarships

There are three essays required as part of the Gilman application: the Statement of Purpose Essay and the two Community Impact Essays, which are the Building Mutual Understanding Essay and the Follow-on Service Project Proposal. For those applying for a Critical Need Language Award (CNLA), an additional essay is required.

Students are highly encouraged to start the process as early as possible and get help from their campus study abroad advisor and writing center tutors. They are great resources!

Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship Program

The U.S. Department of State's Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship Program enables American undergraduate students with high financial need to study or intern abroad through scholarships of up to \$5,000. Students studying critical need languages are eligible for scholarships up to \$8,000. For over 20 years, the Gilman Program has provided access and opportunity to study abroad for more than 38,000 exceptional U.S. undergraduate students, who have gained skills critical to their personal and professional development, as well as for our national security and economic prosperity.

Gilman-McCain Scholarship

for Undergraduate Dependents (child or spouse) of Active or Activated Military Personnel

The U.S. Department of State's John S. McCain International Scholarship for Military Families (Gilman-McCain Scholarship provides awards of \$5,000 for undergraduate dependents (child or spouse) of active or activated United States military personnel to study or intern abroad on credit-bearing programs. Developed under the framework of the State Department's Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship Program, the John S. McCain International Scholarship for Military Families (Gilman-McCain Scholarship) is open to eligible students enrolled at accredited U.S. colleges and universities who receive any type of Title IV federal financial aid.

The Gilman-McCain Scholarship is a congressionally funded initiative of the Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs at the U.S. Department of State and named after the late Senator John S. McCain from Arizona. With the support of the U.S. Congress, this scholarship honors Senator McCain's legacy of public service by enabling undergraduate children and spouses of active or activated United States military personnel to develop the leadership and career readiness skills and global perspective to pursue careers of service and contribute to preserving the principles and alliances that are critical to an international order based on the rule of law, human rights, and democracy.

Eligibility Requirements

- · U.S. citizen or national
- · Undergraduate student in good academic standing
- Dependent (child or spouse) of active or activated United States military personnel during the time of application (including Air Force, Air Force Reserve, Air National Guard, Army, Army National Guard, Army Reserve, Coast Guard, Coast Guard Reserve, Marine Corps, Marine Corps Reserve, Navy, Navy Reserve, Space Force, NOAA Commissioned Corps, and USPHS Commissioned Corps)
- · Recipient of any type of Title IV federal financial aid
- In the process of applying for, or accepted to, a creditbearing study abroad or internship program in a country with an overall Travel Advisory of 1 or 2, according to the U.S. Department of State Travel Advisory System

Award Amount

The Gilman-McCain Scholarship recipients are awarded \$5,000 to be used toward the cost of study abroad or international internship programs.

Passport Processing Times

Routine: 6-8 weeks*

Expedited: 2-3 weeks and an extra \$60*
*Mailing times are not included in processing times.
Processing times only include the time your application is at one of the passport agencies or centers. The total time to get your passport includes both processing and mailing times. It may take up to 2 weeks for applications to arrive by mail at a passport agency or center, and up to 2 weeks for you to receive a completed passport in the mail after it is printed. **Consider the total time it will take to receive your passport when you are booking travel.**

"I always had the goal of getting my passport, but being a mother of three children, life can become very unpredictable. Sometimes that goal would be pushed off because life happens, and unexpected expenses would pop up. Being chosen for the IIE Passport Grant really was a blessing. I was able to get my passport and experience a life changing summer to study abroad in Italy. This was one of the most life changing experiences I have ever had. There were many memorable moments and lessons while studying abroad in Italy, but there is one that really stands out to me. The most important thing I took from living in Italy is that my black is beautiful. One of my biggest fears prior to studying abroad was racism. You hear a lot

of stories, both good and bad, and you wonder what your own experience will be like. There was even a point where I almost talked myself out of it. However, in Italy I was met with nothing but love and acceptance. I received so many compliments and most importantly, respect. For the first time I didn't feel like my "blackness" was the first thing that walked through the door. I will forever be grateful for this experience, and it all started with being accepted to get the IIE Passport Grant."
